



Château du Seuil Graves Rouge 2005

Graves (Bordeaux), France
Dry Red (Cork), 13.0% abv

Let's not worry ourselves too much about the lookalike Château Léoville-Barton label, this blend made by a Kiwi Sean Allison and his Welsh wife Nicola is typically spicy and easy, a traditional, medium-bodied Graves with some rustic, spicy undertones and attractively approachable red berry fruits flavours; would suit game or lamb.

Château du Seuil Bordeaux Rosé 2008

Bordeaux, France
Dry Rosé (Screwcap), 13.5% abv

A fresh, aromatic and promising Bordeaux Rosé, this may not quite take you away, but it has a pleasing capsicum-tinged fresh berry fruit quality thanks to its make-up of Merlot, Cabernet Sauvignon and Cabernet Franc and a stylish dry finish. The Allison's done good.

Château du Seuil Cérons 2006

Cérons (Bordeaux), France
Sweet White (Cork), 12.5% abv

From Nicola and Sean Allison, this is a delightful Sémillon-based Sauternes substitute in a half-bottle with a rich sweet almond and apricot Bakewell tart of a nose and suitably rich peachy fruit sweet fruit, tempered by an attractive orange zestiness and elegant dry aftertaste.
